

PREFACE

Sigmund Freud divided the mind into conscious, subconscious, and unconscious. Freud believed that the unconscious is what shapes the personality of a human. When we look at Art-based therapy, I believe that the unconscious of a child is tapped. I think the point that is understated is that my research is not an intervention and I don't mean for it to be used as an intervention at any point. The research serves the following purposes:

- It is a road map that would help in understanding the kind of intervention that is needed in a child's life. It would help the teachers, therapists, school or any stakeholder in a child's life to understand the child's coping mechanism and his thought processes in a much clear manner.

- The research looks into the various coping mechanisms and resiliency techniques used because with the children of conflict, a lot many times, we don't understand the entry point that we could use to help the child deal with his trauma. The coping mechanisms mentioned provides us with a picture of how the various coping mechanisms are used at various points to deal with the children's traumas, but also in addition they help us to understand the various entry points to deal with a child's trauma.

- At the end of each child's work is their most prominent coping mechanism which acts as a summary. This summary of coping mechanisms helps us understand that we cannot go in with the assumption that cognitive understanding is the only entry point we have, but we have more five ways for a child to deal with his traumas viz Belief, Affect, Social, Imagination and Physiological. The research hence helps us understand and contextualize the narrative and helps us understand where we can intervene with the child.

- As I mentioned, this research is a road map for the stakeholders in a child's life. Every single step/ analysis that is mentioned in the research does not lead to any one thing in particular, every single step/ analysis is important and paramount in its own right. Every single element taps into the unconscious in its own style.

- The research provides rich literature to understand and validate the work of the whole project.

- This method is not just limited to art-based therapy. This can be used in every single setting and with every single person dealing with mental health issues as it dwells into the unconscious in ways that is difficult to get out of the system of any person. It helps us look at the dysfunctions within an individual. I believe that my research is a major tool that would help in the intervention.

I see this research as a responsibility towards my people and myself. Me being a Kashmiri, located in this land, and working in this land with the children is a very important part of me and my identity. I have contributed to this whole project with this very identity (A Kashmiri, a child of conflict, a stakeholder in the conflict) but also looking at it from a non-victim and a distant perspective.

BACKGROUND

In the year 2018, Kashmir was popularized by the name of "The largest prison in the world" and this stands very true as Kashmir is a facsimile of a prison. The whole comparison of Kashmir with the prison does not only comment upon the state enforced control but also the control imposed by the parental authority. Children in conflict areas experience two to three tiers of control. One is the state control, second is social control, and third is familial control. All these controls conjugate and create a prison for the child. The parents vigorously control their children's lives and keep monitoring their actions. This is undoubtedly a way of the state to control the behaviour of people. This behaviour of parents is a result of the systematic violence and oppression that the state subjects the whole population to. In addition, the parents are scared of losing their children to violence and hence they want to create a safe space for their children. People feel that the only way to handle their children is to dominate, to oppress and to tell them what to do. This very idea of control as a means of saving their children is a result of the internalizing of the state's way of control. The internalization of the rage comes forth as a reason of systematic control. A lack of psychological awareness among people, leads to the transference of trauma within generations rather that the trauma getting transformed within.

On the contrary children have this constant feeling of being imprisoned. They don't have a space where they are not controlled. Anywhere they step out they are controlled either by the state or the society or the very structures within. All that they are experiencing externally weighs in a lot in their internal life. The internal life is primarily repressed and fragmented at many levels. A constant cognitive dissonance takes place. Kashmir is the only place in the world where the parents are more terrified when their son comes home late than the girls. The men in the valley are subjected to a lot of physical trauma which leads to psychological trauma. The men are usually the ones who face the physical oppression. The men are exposed to beatings by the army, getting picked up and used as human shields, getting tortured, killed in fake encounters and so on. The young boys feel vulnerable and don't have a chance to express it. The very culture of patriarchy and silence pushes these boys in a deep chasm. The culture being very patriarchal doesn't allow them to express their emotions. This all bottles up and they don't see a way out hence choose violent means of expression like stone pelting or picking up guns.

Kashmiris are very patriarchal and the women or the girls in the valley are expected to act a certain way. This is not just in Kashmir but a very fundamental part of the south Asian culture. The women in the society don't have the means of expressing themselves. We have a very rigid image of how we want our girls to be and how we want them to act. And the girls being an active part of the society try to conform as much as they can to this image of being a perfect daughter to her parents. The women in our society have a constant need of seeking approval from their parents and especially their fathers. This very construct of being a perfect daughter coerces the young women to swallow the pain with a smile on their face. While the men in the society can be vocal and rebel against anything they don't feel right, the women has to let the pain and sufferings sink in. The men have a means of expressing themselves and project their anger on people or objects, the women have to project their emotions inside and it all bottles up. In conclusion, the children don't have a sense of future.

ROLE OF KALAKAR QASBAH

Kalakar Qasbah as a project serves different meanings and purposes to various stakeholders. For children it might be a platform where they can paint and do something different and for the artists it might be an opportunity to provide these children with tools to cope with stress. For me, as a Kashmiri, as a woman and an alumni of Dolphin International School, I understand the value of this program. I wish that I had something like this in my school times; a place and a safe space to express myself. Kashmir has been put through hundreds and thousands of lockdowns and as a result of these lockdowns the very base of the society i.e. education has been deeply impacted. As a reason, education for us is merely textbooks because we could never have a chance to get something beyond these textbooks. We never had dance societies where we could dance our hearts out, we never had poetry clubs to realise that Oh we can be poets, we had arts class but it was something for kindergarten kids and was all about colouring the books, we never had book clubs where we could find our love for books, we never had debate societies were we could try and make our points. The point is that our lives have been nothing more than textbooks. In case, we were/are offered something beyond that we generally try to avoid it because we feel it is not important because what is important is the textbooks and the syllabus that needs to be finished. Children and adults have developed a general dislike or avoid getting into these things.

How these programmes work is that they work with our inner self and transform us in ways which is not overt but covert. Through my research, I have tried my best to observe these changes which may not be evident on the outside but has shifted the person from inside. People generally project whenever they are writing stories or drawing and this space where they feel like they have said through characters liberates them in many ways.

Children require a safe, nurturing and supportive family and community to grow to be physically and psychologically healthy. Children who are exposed to extreme stress, violence or neglect are children at risk.

Children all over the world live in extremely dangerous environments and are exposed to the stress and trauma of extreme poverty, war, terrorism, civil strife, urban and tribal hostilities and physical, sexual and mental abuse. These traumatic experiences may manifest themselves in the form of delinquent or otherwise disturbed behaviour and may result in either individual or social maladjustment.

THE "BASIC PH"- MODEL OF COPING AND RESILIENCY

By- MOOLI LAHAD, MIRI SHACHAM AND ORA AYALON

This 'BASIC Ph model of coping and resiliency' by two Israeli psychologists, Lahad and Ayalon, is a widely used and effective resiliency assessment, intervention and recovery model. The book explains the model, its usefulness and its applications in Hurricane Katrina, in family therapy, in families in terror, with first year nursing students, how Jewish and Arab parents perceived their children's resiliency in the Second Lebanon War, adolescents in the Yugoslav War, and in building business resilience in small to medium businesses.

It details answers to the question: What is helping you make it day by day?

Its name comes from its six 'channels' or languages for dealing with trauma and building resilience: Belief and values, Affect, Social, imagination, Cognitive, and Physiological. Lahad and Leykin explain: "The model represents an integrative and multifaceted approach that suggests that each person has a personal combination of these elements which forms his/her unique coping style" (p. 11). With many helpful tables and much statistical evidence, they make a strong case that different people cope within these six different ways ("coping styles and coping mechanisms"), and that generally women use more coping mechanisms than men (p. 38). The Model offers ways to look for coping mechanisms

within ourselves, to regain "the ability to function in daily routine conditions and recover in a state of emergency" (253).

21st century research studies are grouped finding associations between coping modes and psychological constructs related to resilience such as self-efficacy, optimism, and locus of control. For example, in one study (in 2011 p. 39), Nadim examined associations between the Model and sense of coherence (SOC) among Arab adolescents aged 13-18 living in political uncertainty. She found that the only predictor of current stress symptoms was expression of emotions (A) and the only significant predictor of SOC was cognitive coping (C). I found the successful use of the model for building the "new normal" with the 'first responders' in Hurricane Katrina in Chapter 14 fascinating reading.

The whole research is based on the idea that human beings are story telling beings. We always share stories in our everyday life. We tell people stories about ourselves, other people and our surroundings. We humans constantly tailor stories. The book suggests that people will tell their stories using mostly Cognition and Social Factors and Affect. The personal combination of each and every one forms our BASIC PH.

BASIC PH, an integrative multi-dimensional coping model was introduced by Lahad. It proposes six modes of coping based on six different personality theories that, historically have been influential in explaining human adaptation to stress. These dimensions of coping underlie the coping style of the individual: BELIEF, AFFECT, SOCIAL, IMAGINATION, COGNITION AND PHYSIOLOGY (BASIC PH).

The first and original method for researching the BASIC PH model is by utilizing the Six-Part Story Method(6PSM). It is a projective tool which aims to identify the major coping modes or resources that the individual possesses. The tool is suitable for children and adult participants who are asked to create a story.

RESEARCH FRAMEWORK

The research is a detailed study of the stories of seven students who have been a part of Kalakar Qasbah throughout. For every student, six stories have been taken and analysed mainly using the BASIC Ph model. However, certain changes and additions have been made accordingly, for the model to be apt for the stories written by the students of Kalakar Qasbah.

The basis of the 6PSM lies as an assessment tool lies in the psycholinguistic frame suggesting that people build their stories according to the way in which they absorb information, and transmit messages to the world in specific psycholinguistics idioms through the BASIC PH modalities. The assumption is that by asking the client to tell a projected story, the therapist may be able to extract the way that the person projects itself into reality in order to meet the world.

In order to record a participant story, beside the psycholinguistics aspect, there are various levels of assessment, that includes the following:

THE COPING STYLE

The coping style is the closest to client's awareness. BASIC Ph is used as a model to categorize the contents. The BASIC PH represents six channels of coping. In BASIC Ph, each alphabet stands for a coping mechanism that dominates a person's manner of coping. B stands for belief, A stands for affect, S stands for social, I stands for imagination, C stands for cognition and Ph stands for physiological. Almost every word in the story is labelled using the six coping mechanism viz B, A, S, I, C, and Ph. After labelling the words, we count the number of words categorised under B, A, S, I, C and Ph respectively. In order, to make it easier to understand the frequency of each coping mechanism, the scores are put in a table. The top three coping mechanisms used in the story, form the apparent language and the three least used coping mechanisms form the forgotten language. The combination of each mechanism is analysed and is interpreted accordingly.

PERCENTAGE OF THE BASIC PH WORDS

<u>USED</u>

For the next step of the detailed analysis, an addition of each coping mechanism used is made to form the overall score. Then each coping mechanism is taken individually and divided by the overall score, to give us a percentage of each word used. This is then translated into a pie chart, to give a visual representation of the used coping mechanisms in the given story.

THEMES

The next step involves reading the story and looking for a central theme.

CONFLICTS

This level probes into the unconscious. This level uses a psycholinguistic approach while adopting a psychodynamic point of view. Fenichel (1945) maintains "The neurotic conflict, by definition, is one between the tendency striving for discharge and another tendency that tries to prevent this discharge." The symptoms are actions that are taken against the anxieties that underlie behaviours and conflicts. In literary form, actions are represented by verbs and adverbs. We, hence, look for all the verbs and adverbs in the story. They are then jotted down and contrast each one with the opposite verbs/ adverbs, thus uncovering the opposite intention or conflict. The list of opposites reveals the possible conflicts.

The psychological clusters have been taken from the 16 personality factors given by Raymond Cattell. This is based on the trait approach of personality. These 16 PF's form the psychological clusters which are as follows-

- 1. Group dependent vs Self sufficient
- 2. Relaxed vs Tense
- 3. Forthright vs Shrewd
- 4. Self-assured vs Apprehensive
- 5. Serious vs Happy go lucky
- 6. Submissive vs Dominant
- 7. Affected by feelings vs Emotionally stable
- 8. Trusting vs Suspicious
- 9. Reserved vs Outgoing
- 10.Less intelligent vs More intelligent
- 11.Conservative vs Experimenting
- 12. Practical vs Imaginative
- 13.Uncontrolled vs Controlled
- 14. Tough minded vs Sensitive
- 15. Timid vs Venturesome
- 16.Expedient vs Conscientious

TABLE OF CONFLICTS

This gives us a number to how many time each conflict has occurred throughout.

SUMMARY OF CONFLICTS

This very aspect gives us an insight into what the most prominent conflict resides in the person. This is then combined with second highest conflict in the individual, to combine them and make a meaningful statement out of it. It tells us what are the most prominent conflicts in an individual.

We need to understand that just because one conflict is more prominent that doesn't mean that this is the only conflict that exits and the others are null and void. It simply means that more actions are taken against this particular anxiety. Other conflicts also have a strong effect on the individual but the most prominent one is that truly defines the actions and influence on a slightly greater level.

SYMBOLS

This level involves the analysis of the symbols. By applying the psychoanalytic anthropological or other approaches to understand the symbols of the client.

For this research "A Dictionary of Symbols" by Juan Eduardo Cirlot is used to look for the symbols. For this purpose, every word that is present in the story is looked for in the dictionary and its meaning is then used to analyse the story.

INSIGHT OF THE STORY USING THE

SYMBOLS

The final step for the analysis of the story is to look at the story from the prism of the symbols. We insert the meaning of each symbol in the story and see what the individual is actually thinking about. The story gets a totally different theme and a meaning once these symbols are used to look at the story. This gives us a much detailed insight into the mind of the individual.

CONCLUSION OF PARTICIPANT'S STORIES

This section is an amalgamation of all the different levels of all the stories. This gives us an insight into the final work of the participant and the analysis. One of the key features of the final analysis is the amalgamation of the scores of all the coping mechanisms. This gives us a visual representation of how over the period of different stories and time, the use of a coping mechanism has changed.

<u>RIYA</u>

Something that always amuses me is how much a person can change over the period of years. I have seen Riya ever since I was her senior in school. I vividly remember how we all called Gunn Gunn which means the notes of a song. She was always a very jolly kid, always smiling and dancing around. Riya has completely changed from being a very happy person to a person who seems to be very frightened and embarrassed. Riya is a Kashmiri Pandit, hence a minority here in Kashmir and in the school and most of the spaces she ever gets to be a part of.

Riya has always been hesitant to share her thoughts and ideas and prefers to stay quiet most of the time. Over the period of time, I observed that even if she doesn't speak through words she turned out to be an amazing artist and one of the bests that Kalakar Qasbah has. Her design for the wall mural has to be one of the best. If it wasn't for this programme, the walls would be empty and now these walls are a canvas to these amazing artists that were discovered through Kalakar Qasbah.

Riya's work has always fascinated the facilitators and everyone around. Below is the analysis of six of her stories, which will help me mark her progress through these 10 months.

THE APPARENT LANGUAGE

The I here is the most prominent coping mechanism. The I being dominant means that the individual relies completely on their imagination to deal with stress. The C being the second highly used coping mechanism means a higher IQ and fewer cognitive complaints. The combination of I & C further conveys that the individual has a strong hold on their cognitive competencies and know how to maintain a balance between reality and imagination. The PH being the third highly used coping mechanism means physical activity and attractiveness. The I along with C, PH creates confident optimism and skilled expressiveness. The S-indicates that the S is in conflict which implies social withdrawal and isolation.

In addition, Riya has clearly exhibited over the time that she resorts to her imagination quite often. Upon her interaction with the facilitators she has said that when stressed, she would start imagining and start talking to plants to feel better.


THE FORGOTTEN LANGUAGE

B, A, S are the forgotten languages. This means that there is a lack of social support and help and hence it is rarely used as a coping mechanism. The B being another forgotten language means lack of belief in themselves and not using A as a coping mechanism means internalising and social withdrawal.

SUMMARY OF CONFLICTS

The conflict of the unconscious that seems quite present while the story was written is that of being tough minded vs sensitive. There seems to be the most conflict pertaining to this cluster. The inner battle for the person is mostly about seeming tough-minded but at the same time it is trying to mask the sensitivity of the self. The sensitive aspect seems more true for Riya as has been observed over the course of Kalakar Qasbah.

Other than the cluster of Tough minded vs Sensitive, Forthright vs Shrewd, Affected by Feelings vs Emotionally Stable and Timid vs Venturesome are also seen as active conflicts. The cluster of Tough Minded vs Sensitive when taken along with Affected by Feelings vs Emotionally Stable helps us look at the aspect of being tough minded and sensitive through a prism of feelings. It may be deduced that being tough minded equals emotional stability while as being sensitive equals Affected by feelings. Riya has been seen as an individual who is very sensitive and emotional. We can hence safely presume that Riyas' conflicts revolve around her emotions.

SYMBOLS

- **1. Fairy:** symbolizes the supra-normal powers of the human soul. Their nature is contradictory: they fulfil humble tasks, yet possess extraordinary powers.
- 2. Cloud: Symbolic messenger.
- 3. Stars: Night, multiplicity or disintegration
- **4. Butterfly:** Emblem of the soul and of unconscious attraction towards the light.

INSIGHT OF THE STORY USING THE SYMBOLS

The role of Fairy has been the same as defined in the dictionary of symbols. Here in the story also, the fairy is fulfilling a humble task of saving her people and has extraordinary powers that she is using to save her people. The cloud in the story is seen as a friend as well as a barrier to help protect against the spells. We can decipher that she is using the messenger as a friend and at the same time as a barrier which is supposed to carry a message of that of protection. In addition, everyone is trying to save the butterfly which represents the soul and at the same time the unconscious attraction towards light. We can say that everyone is trying to protect the soul and the light of the land.

STORY

BUTTERFLY- Hey, I am a radiant butterfly. I am going on a journey. My journey starts from a grassland. The grassland is very dry and has no flowers here. Uhhhh! Oh! I can see some dried flowers but what can I do with dried flowers. Lalal! Oh! Oh! I can see some tulips. White, white tulips! So nice but I like roses. No worry! I can see a parrot. Hey Parrot! Can you tell me where will I find many flowers ?

THE APPARENT LANGUAGE

In this story, the most prominently used coping mechanisms are C, PH, A. Higher score in C implies that the person has a higher IQ and has fewer cognitive complaints. This can be reflected in the child's performance at school, where she has been the topper of the class. A score of 12 in Ph translates to behavioural coping and active coping. A combination of Ph and C implies that the person is practical and rational. It also implies that the person can plan and perform well. A combination of C and A might imply that the person is emotional but they are also practical about it. A higher score in A represents an emotional approach to things and can also suggest A higher score in C might imply that the person thinks with their mind rather than their heart.

THE FORGOTTEN LANGUAGE


In this story, B, I, S are the forgotten languages. This can imply that the person lacks belief in themselves. It can also convey that the person gives up easily and that the person fails to draw strength from adversity. They are also not very social and an S- proves that they may see others as obstacles. They are quite anti-social and they lack social support. The lack

of I as a coping mechanism suggests escapist fantasy, mental disengagement and wishful thinking.

SUMMARY OF CONFLICTS

The most pre-dominantly existing conflict is that of control. The conflict that arises is controlled vs uncontrolled. The person feels issues with

control. They mostly fear being controlled and such has been informed by the individual. The second conflict is that of less intelligent vs more intelligent. This can easily be traced to cognition. As seen above, in this story cognition as a coping mechanism is actively used. We might deduce that one of the complaints of the individual is that of seeming less intelligent. But then that is the fear that lives inside the individual while the person is very bright and sharp cognitively.

SYMBOLS

- **1. Butterfly**: Emblem of the soul and of unconscious attraction towards the light.
- 2. Flowers- symbolic to the transitoriness of spring and of beauty.
- 3. Tulip- Tulip is expressive of active spirituality
- 4. White- White symbolises intelligence and purity.
- **5. Rose-** Rose is a symbol of completion, of consummate achievement and perfection.
- 6. Parrot- Parrot seeks the water of immortality.
- 7. Bear- In alchemy, the bear corresponds to the Negredo of prime matter, and hence it is related to all initial stages and to the instincts. It has consequently been considered a symbol of the perilous aspect of the unconscious and as an attribute of the man who is cruel and crude

INSIGHT OF THE STORY USING THE SYMBOLS

The journey stands with the butterfly that represents the soul and it also represents the unconscious attraction towards the light. As the story starts, the butterfly has started a journey. As per the symbols, it can be said that the journey is that of finding the light. The butterfly i.e., the soul starts looking for beauty and spring, however transitory. It can be said that the soul is looking for something beautiful, only to realize that it is quite transitory. The soul, hence, is in the hunt for something that is ephemeral. While looking for the flowers, she stumbles upon dried flowers rather than fresh flowers. Fresh flowers even though are something that are fresh and in demand, dried flowers on the other hand are something that are not as beautiful but live in forever. We can see how the search for something more beautiful, even though short-lived, is what the soul seeks and denies something that might last longer but isn't that beautiful. The person then stumbles upon white tulips that represent active spirituality, intelligence and purity but then she believes that roses are better that represent a symbol of completion, achievement and perfection. We see in the percentage chart, how belief is something that lacks in the individual. The individual, even though, feels that spirituality, intelligence and purity are some qualities that are nice to have but they prefer to be perfect and rather achieve. Up until this point, it is shown how the individual is on a path to make themselves perfect in the eyes of the world and how they appear to the world and care less about what's inside. At least it is something what they are made to feel, if it is not something what they actually strive for.

Then, as the butterfly seeks for roses, the parrot helps her in the journey by telling her the path. The parrot being a representative of immortality, the soul hence seeks for something temporary but wants to make it permanent. She then finds out a bear which is a representative of a cruel and a crude soul. The individual is scared that in her journey towards the light or the beauty, she would stumble upon a bear/ man who would make her journey towards the light impossible. But after all the odds, she manages to get home. She manages to find the light after all her fights.

THE APPARENT LANGUAGE

The PH, S here are the most prominent coping mechanisms. The PH & S being dominant means that the individual relies on their physiological aspect to deal with stress and they also rely on their social skills to deal with stress. A combination of both PH & S could mean the use of body in a social setting or can take an active role. However an S- means that the S is in conflict and hence implies that the person may see other people in a social setting as obstacles and hence influencing her behaviour in a social setting. The C is the second prominently used coping mechanism. The C interacts with PH to ensure a practical, rational behaviour. The C also interacts with S; which implies social norms and rules that is - likes a structured and well defined role. An S- implies that the person may find it difficult to adhere to some rules.

THE FORGOTTEN LANGUAGE

B, A, I are the forgotten languages. The B being a forgotten language means lack of belief in themselves and not using A as a coping mechanism means internalising and social withdrawal. Lack of I implies mental disengagement.

The story of the land of yellow has been associated with the story of land of blue. The prince has a dream of becoming a king; which is a much powerful position than a prince. There is a fight between the prince and another king to prove his competence but then the prince loses and is imprisoned. He escapes the prison only to land in another prison where he is transformed into a butterfly by the evil witches. He escapes and ends up in land of blue where fairy, clouds and stars help protecting him. They win and his father comes and finds him alive and makes him the king.

SUMMARY OF CONFLICTS

The most prominent conflict is that of Self-assured vs Apprehensive and the second most prominent conflict is Timid vs Venturesome. It conveys that the individuals major conflict is apprehensive vs Self-assured and looking at Riya as an individual and knowing her personally, she is quite Timid and apprehensive but to others she surely looks like an individual who is self-assured and venturesome. In order to mask herself doubt and her insecurities, she portrays herself as an individual who is really smart, which she surely is, just for others to feel that she is quite confident about herself.

SYMBOLS

 King: expresses the ruling or governing principle, supreme consciousness, and the virtues of sound judgement and self-control. At the same time, a coronation is equivalent to achievement, victory and consummation. Any man may be called a king when he achieves the culminating point in the unfolding of his individual life.

- 2. Fight: All combats are expression of a conflict of some sort.
- **3.** Loss: On the one hand, the sense of loss is bound up with the feeling of guilt together with a presentiment of ultimate purification or pilgrimage and journeying. On the other hand, the idea of losing and of rediscovering oneself, or the notion of the 'lost object' that is missed very painfully, are concepts parallel to that of death and resurrection
- **4. Butterfly:** Emblem of the soul and of unconscious attraction towards the light.
- **5. Fairy:** symbolizes the supra-normal powers of the human soul. Their nature is contradictory: they fulfil humble tasks, yet possess extraordinary powers.

INSIGHT OF THE STORY USING THE SYMBOLS

The story is connected to the stories above but it actually takes us to a time before the butterfly went on her journey to the blue land and home. This is about a prince who is striving to be king. This represents supreme consciousness and the virtues of sound judgement and self-control. In context of the story earlier and the individual, the striving for self-control seems much apt. The individual feels that being a prince means getting control while being a king is about self-control. The individual wants to take control of their own life but they are made to fight for this and this fight is lost. They are then sent to a prison. This may suggest that while they claim their self-control, they are imprisoned for their guardian doesn't feel they are eligible and hence reprimanded for asking for that self-control when they weren't even worth it. They then escape and reach the witches who turn him into a butterfly. The witches transform him into

something they are not. The only thing in the butterfly that remains the same is their soul and then he goes to the fairies who save him and then they are made the king. This can also be a dream where they feel like I they take extreme steps, they will be prized with self-control.

CONCLUSION

The person has shifted to a different language. The I which was the main coping mechanism to deal with stress seems to have been gone dormant at the moment. The person has shifted from I to S, which may be a reason of the Kalakar Qasbah. Being a part of Kalakar Qasbah might have given her a sense of belonging and hence the S became active.

The prince wants to be in a powerful position that is a hunger for being more powerful than he already is. Even when there is a claim made that the father loves the Prince he still subjects him to a battle to test his worth which he fails and the prince is imprisoned. He escapes and ends in a wrong place. He is transformed into a butterfly and escapes yet again only to be saved by others but not himself. His father is happy to find him alive and gives him the title of king easily.

The narrative reflected here can be linked to the narrative of parental control and rage. Even when the parents love their children dearly, the children are made to feel that in order for them to be deserving of their love they have to prove their worth to the parents. The parents are figures who have been through years of trauma and systematic oppression, they in turn treat their children with the same amount of sternness that they received from the state and hence they imprison their children psychologically. The children try their best to break free of these shackles but they end up in the wrong place. This wrong place usually is a harmful way of channelising emotions or even violent means of expressing their anger towards parental authority which is directed towards the state

authority sometimes. The children try to keep escaping in search of a better place. This game of escaping is continued through their life.

The girls and the woman in the society are again dearly loved by their parental figures but this love comes with its own limitations. In the South Asian

culture the women are psychologically considered as minors and hence their lie is mostly governed by their fathers or husbands. The girls are used to getting controlled by their parents and then they try to escape that by seeking love outside. They keep getting the same kind of behaviour from the external sources of love too and they then try to escape it too. But then the whole narrative that the butterfly flies to the land of blue only to be protected by the Fairy and stars and moon, tells us how the girls in this society want others to fight for them rather than them fighting their demons.

The end of the story is that the king is happy to find the prince alive and makes him the king. The pattern to notice here is how even after getting imprisoned and facing so much of difficulties; even getting transformed from a human to a butterfly, the prince doesn't confront his father on how he hurt him in so many ways. He simply forgets all that he went through and goes on happily to be the king. This is the narrative that is repeated over and over here, even when the children are subjected through so much of mental trauma, they don't even let their parents know what all they have gone through, they just keep living happily overtly.

The PH, A, S here are the most prominent coping mechanisms. The PH is the highest coping mechanism used which implies that there is a physical activity involved to a greater extent. The PH, A, S interact to imply temperamental characteristics of a child which favours deescalation and self-control in general as well as in acute crises but also promotes an overall uncomplicated child-parent relationship, even if both parents are in chronic discord; easy temperament. The child has a 5 S-which means there may be anti-social action, the child may feel different and withdraws. There is a social withdrawal and self-isolation. The A, S together implies that there was an availability of an emotionally stable and trustworthy person during early childhood.


THE FORGOTTEN LANGUAGE



The PH, S here are the most prominent coping mechanisms. The PH &S being dominant means that the individual relies on their physiological aspect to deal with stress and they also rely on their social skills to deal with stress. A combination of both PH & S could mean the use of body in a social setting or can take an active role. However an S- means that the S is in conflict and hence implies that the person may see other people in a social setting as obstacles and hence influencing her behaviour in a social setting. The C is the second prominently used coping mechanism. The C interacts with PH to ensure a practical, rational behaviour. The C also interacts with S; which implies social norms and rules that is - likes a structured and well defined role. An S- implies that the person may find it difficult to adhere to some rules.











Music represents an intermediate zone between the differentiated or


material world, and the undifferentiated realm of the 'pure will' of Schopenhauer.

- 7. SOUND-In India, the sound of Krishna's flute is the magical cause of the birth of the world. The pre-Hellenic maternal goddesses are depicted holding lyres, and with the same significance. There are other traditional doctrines which hold that sound was the first of all things to be created, and that which gave rise to all others, commencing with light, or, alternatively, with air and fire.
- 8. HUT- House as a home arouses strong, spontaneous associations with the human body and human thought (or life, in other words), as has been confirmed empirically by psychoanalysts. 

MECHANISM


'BELIEF' AS A COPING MECHANISM









The butterfly keeps looking for a place and then flies over the sea, which is quite unlikely for a butterfly. The phrase return to sea, which represents dying gives us a deep symbolism. The butterfly carrying her eggs hovers over the sea which represents how the butterfly and the future generations are so close to death yet they are safe. Then the butterfly finds a boat on the bank of the sea. The boat is a cradle rediscovered. So, even though the boat lies on the sea, hence close to death, yet the boat being a vehicle is a safe.



There is inhibition of actions by suppressing feelings. Combined with A it could mean self-destruction. A also conveys emotional ventilation and discharge. Along with Oh, it means physical release of emotions. Along with C, it means crying-problem focused. It also means suppression of emotions.


SUMMARY OF FORGOTTEN LANGUAGE







LIMITATIONS OF THE RESEARCH

One of the very basic principles of psychological research that I have learnt from my 6 years of studying psychology is that it does not matter if the results are different from what we expected, we need to look at how it can benefit the community and publish the same. This research has given me a great insight into the minds of the children, yet I felt the tools at times weren't apt. I expected the research to form a certain curve, which did not happen but yet I have the answers to why it did not.

The best part of this research is that it is not just numbers, or just words, it is a mixed method research. I tried putting a value to see the change which worked when the stories followed a certain protocol. Following are the points and steps that I feel should be taken if this method is used in the future to conduct more researches.

STORY TELLING SKILLS

The very fact that these students haven't been through formal education is kind of reflected in the stories. The students are great artists, yet a lack of formal education is clearly reflected in their story making skills. The students made up stories that were too realistic, to be precise, their stories lacked that figment of imagination and it is portrayed in the I coping mechanism scores. Riya was the only child whose stories were filled with her imagination and it is her stories that have contributed the most to the research. The other children on the other hand have kind of kept their stories too literal.

To deal with this issue, the best thing would be to make these students go through some sort of story making workshop, where they would learn how to use their words in a proper way.

LACK OF IMAGINATION

As mentioned, the stories lack a figment of imagination. The only imaginary character that is used is the butterfly and that is a character that had been introduced prior to the story writing. The children should be made familiar with imaginary characters and figures.

The culture of Pulwama is such that the children aren't familiar with the imaginary characters and how different characters can be used in a story to make it magical. The children should be familiarised with various stories from books or movies that would help them explore their imagination.

Familiarising them with magical or imaginary characters would not only make their stories better but it would help a lot with the research. When they use various characters, the researcher would be able to understand the reason why different characters have been used and contribute greatly to the research.

It would also be cathartic for the children, as they would project their life into these characters and provide them with a psychological safe space.

LACK OF CHARACTERS

The stories by the children lacked characters. The characters used would hardly make any contribution to the research. The characters proved to be of little help to the main character. The more the characters, the more the projection and the more the catharsis.

<u>A NEED FOR CONSTANT SUPERVISION</u> <u>WHILE STORY WRITING</u>

The drill for the Kalakar Qasbah students was that they would paint and then write down their stories. This whole time the student was mostly left alone with their thoughts to help, which is the drill. But for the sake of the research, as great step would be to include a teacher or a person who has great story telling skills and can prompt the children to think more deeply about what they have drawn and hence come up with a story that can be beneficial for the research. Stories by Zeeshan and a few by Shafiya were too short and described the picture in just a few words with zero room for imagination or interpretation.

While writing the stories, the children need to be at prompted to think deeper into the context.

LACK OF PROPER GUIDELINES IN THE BASIC PH BOOK BY MOOLI LAHAD

The book is one of the greatest contributors in the research as it has provided the maximum framework for the research. The problem in the book is that the steps to the research have not been defined properly. An example has been given as to what framework to follow while conducting the research but a gigantic room is left for doubts. There is too little information in the book. A tiny story and its interpretation is provided for the reader to understand how to go about the research but it is impossible to follow the way of Mooli Lahad in particular because of the said reason. Because of this reason, the researcher is left with a little information and hence the research and the interpretation has to be completely subjective.

UNEXPLAINED ELEMENTS IN THE STEPS OF

INTERPRETATION

As mentioned the book has very small example on how to interpret the stories. Because of this very reason some aspects in the interpretation have been left unexplained. For example the presence of B-, A-, S-, I-, C- AND PH- is not explained at all. But in order to remain true to the step, they have been mentioned in the research.

DICTIONARY OF SYMBOLS

The dictionary of symbols by Cirlot have been of great help in deeply interpreting the story but it has been blind to the cultural differences that may prevail. This dictionary might work much more efficiently in a western culture.
